## GET MORE READY PLAYERS ON THE FIELD

- We will fight in a Joint and Combined warfighting ecosystem to defeat the adversary's own system of war
- We must build readiness and capability now as we partner to scale industrial capacity and expand budgets
- We will grow the force: people, ships, submarines, aircraft, munitions, logistics, and networks

## **CLARITY OF PURPOSE**

- We will align the Navy Staff to the needs of the warfighters and our warfighting fleets
- We do not need a radically new plan;
   We need to move faster with the plans we have
- To gain ground without losing speed, the Navy will execute the NAVPLAN through existing processes





Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Lisa Franchetti released a highly anticipated report this month that outlines seven strategies the Navy will follow to ensure the U.S. is prepared for a potential conflict with China by 2027. That's the date Chinese leader Xi Jinping has told his forces to be ready for a potential invasion of the self-governing island nation of Taiwan, which Beijing sees as historically part of the mainland.

The 2027 date does not mean a war will happen that year, but the Navy wants to ensure it is ready — if an enhanced U.S. force does not deter Xi from an invasion.

Franchetti's strategic plan zeroes in on how the Navy, the key military branch in the event of a South China Sea conflict, can best prepare itself given multiple constraints, including a troubled shipbuilding industry and historically low recruitment.

# Commandants Planning Guidance

My priorities remain: (1) Balancing Crisis Response and Modernization, (2) Naval Integration and Organic Mobility, (3) Quality of Life, (4) Recruit, Make, and Retain Marines; and (5) Maximize the Potential of our Reserves.

These priorities drive my decisions as Commandant and are woven throughout the document. My Planning Guidance provides the context for us to achieve those priorities so we can fight and win today and set conditions to win in the future.







The 2022 National Defense Strategy (NDS) prioritizes the People's Republic of China (PRC) as the pacing challenge, and the Marine Corps will continue to modernize to meet it. <u>Force Design</u> remains the Marine Corps' vehicle to create innovative formations, equipment, and concepts and ensures we remain lethal on any battlefield while optimized against the pacing challenge.






