Trojan Battalion Participates in 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb

On September 11, the Trojan Battalion stood in solidarity with the USC and greater Los Angeles communities to honor the nearly 3,000 lives lost during the terrorist attacks 24 years ago.

At the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, active-duty service members, midshipmen, cadets, first responders, and civilians came together to participate in the 9/11 Stair Climb, an event symbolizing both remembrance and resilience. Participants climbed 2,997 steps, each one representing a life lost on that tragic day in 2001. The experience served as a moving tribute to the bravery and sacrifice of those who responded to the crisis, as well as a moment of reflection on the enduring impact of that day on our nation.

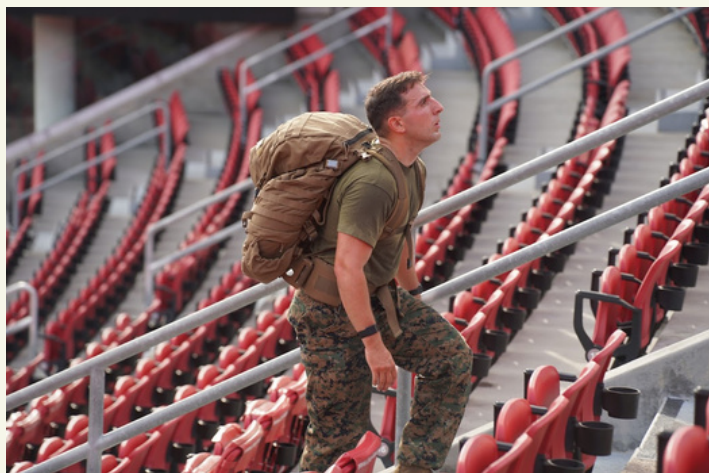

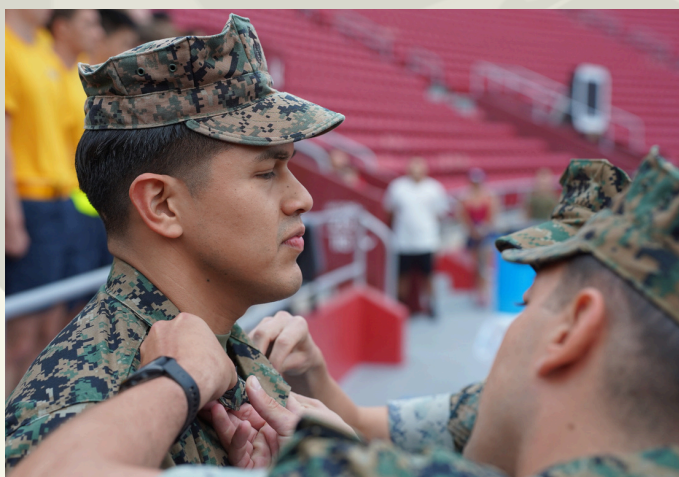
Attention to Orders: SSgt to GySgt

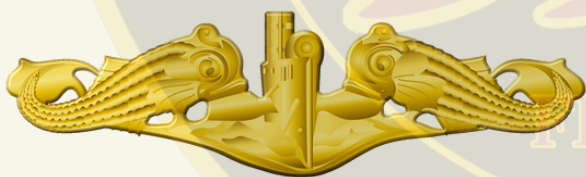

Distinguished Alumni: Shooting for the Stars

On September 22, 2025, NASA unveiled its newest class of astronauts. Among the select few, one familiar name stood out. From more than 8,000 applicants, Katherine Spies '04 secured her place in the nation's storied space program.

LtCol. Katherine Spies, a San Diego native, graduated from USC in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering. She commissioned into the United States Marine Corps, flying the AH-1 Cobra attack helicopter. Over the course of her distinguished career, she earned a master's degree in engineering from Harvard University, served as a Naval Test Pilot, and continues her service today in the Marine Corps Reserve. Beyond her military career, Spies led as an engineering manager for Amazon's autonomous drone delivery program before being accepted into the astronaut program.

She is the 3rd USC NROTC alum to become an astronaut.

Reagan Library Visit

On September 27th, members of the USC NROTC Alumni League hosted MIDN 1/C Aragon, MIDN 1/C Williams, and MIDN 1/C Briand for a memorable visit to the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley. The group was warmly welcomed by Alumni League President Col James Hull, USMC (Ret.) '82, along with fellow alumni Tom Offut '73, C.S. Miller '54, David Cole '88, Eddie Tannenbaum '62, Jon Simmons '76, Bob Frankel '79, and Dave Waran '79.

The tour, led by knowledgeable docents, guided the group through highlights of President Reagan's life and presidency, including exhibits on the Cold War, the Strategic Defense Initiative, and artifacts from his years as governor of California. They entered the Air Force One Pavilion to view and climb aboard SAM 27000, the modified Boeing 707 that served as Air Force One for seven U.S. presidents, and the accompanying motorcade vehicles, including the presidential limousine and Secret Service Suburban. They also visited a former Marine One helicopter (a Sikorsky VH-3A) and paused at the beautiful hilltop memorial site where President and First Lady Reagan are laid to rest. After the tour, the group gathered for lunch at the Gipper's Bistro adjacent to the museum, enjoying good food, camaraderie, and the chance to hear alumni share stories of their time in the Navy and Marine Corps.
