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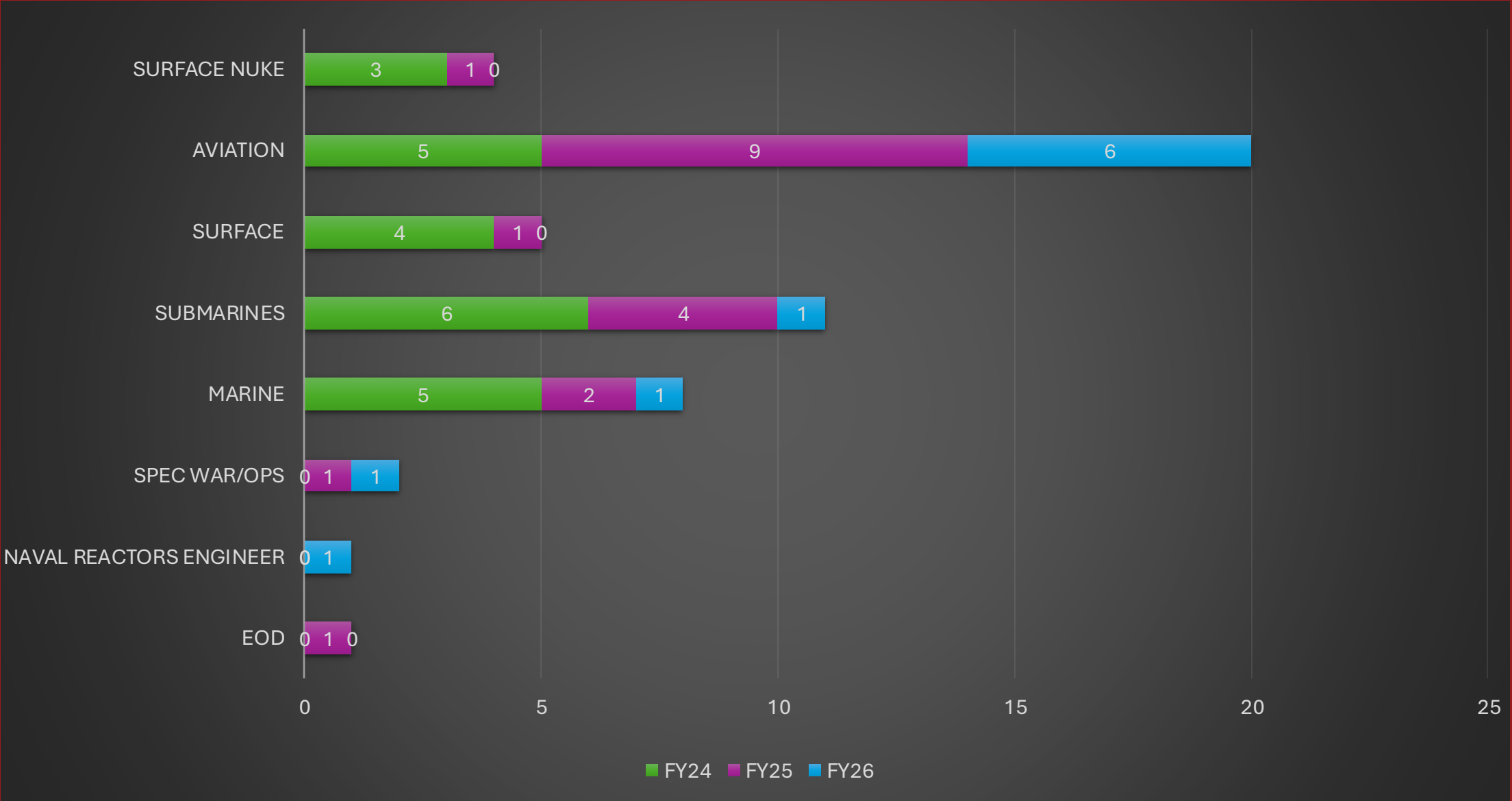

Purpose & Alignment with NSTC Mission:

The Trojan Battalion's Battle Study directly supported **NSTC's mission to transform volunteers into warfighters** by developing the values, knowledge, and skills essential for future naval and Marine officers.

This immersive experience advanced the **Commanding Officer's priorities of Professional Development, Naval Proficiency, and Fostering a Culture of Excellence** through hands-on study of leadership and decision-making in combat.

The Battle Study offered midshipmen a chance to connect **classroom instruction to the realities of war**, walking the same ground where Marines and Sailors shaped modern amphibious and joint warfare. Through guided discussions, student-led research, and reflection, participants explored how courage, adaptability, and initiative shaped history, and will define their own service in the Fleet.

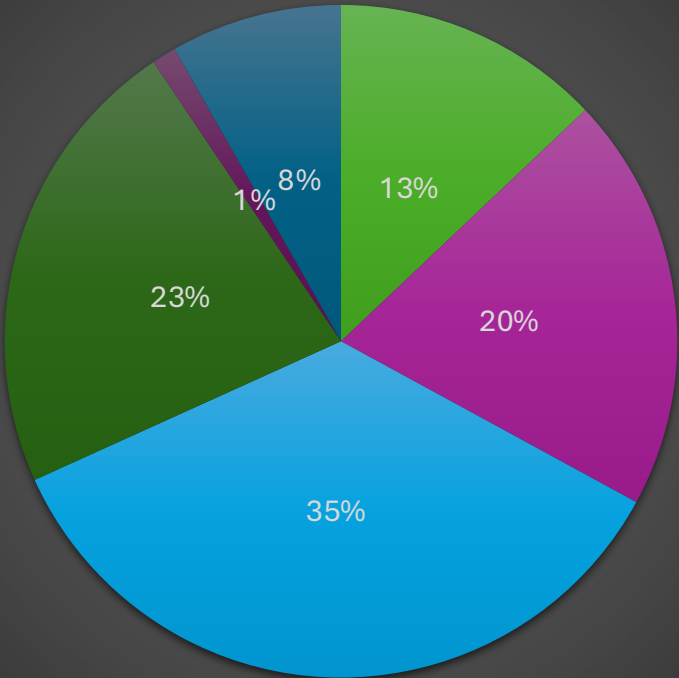
