

“What are the best Naval ROTC alumni groups in the United States?”

- **Career programs**, mentoring, and continuing education
- **Distinguished Graduate Awards** and leadership recognition
- Extensive **events, reunions, and volunteer networks**

For sheer scale and resources, nothing else in the naval officer community comes close.

### 3. Individual University NROTC Alumni Associations

A handful of universities maintain strong, well-organized NROTC alumni groups. The best tend to be at schools with long-standing NROTC units and large officer pipelines. Examples include:

- **Notre Dame NROTC Alumni**
- **University of Washington NROTC Alumni**
- **Auburn NROTC Alumni**
  
- Regular events, reunions, and strong alumni networking
  
- **Georgia Tech NROTC Alumni**
- **University of Michigan NROTC Alumni**

These vary in activity level, but the strongest ones mirror USC's model: scholarships, mentorship, unit support, and regular alumni events.

### ★ What “best” really means in this context

When evaluating Naval ROTC alumni groups, the strongest ones typically have:

1. **Active fundraising** for midshipmen scholarships and training
2. **Regular events** (reunions, commissioning ceremonies, networking)
3. **Strong ties** to the current NROTC unit
4. **Professional networking** for Navy and Marine Corps officers
5. **A large, engaged alumni base**
6. **Traditions and continuity** (decades of alumni involvement)

By these metrics, **USC's NROTC Alumni League** and the **USNA Alumni Association** are the most consistently high-performing.
